Getting our License Plates MADE

Yes, our Rotary License Plates legislation has been passed by our state government. However, before our RLP (Rotary License Plates) will be MADE, Rotary is required to submit 7500 paid applications to the DMV before our deadline, December 31, 2002. As of January 1, 2002, we had 456 applications submitted. That means that California Rotarians must pull together, and do what is necessary to get our deadline met. Clubs and Districts all over the state already are putting systems in place. They all see the HUGE DOLLAR value these license plates can bring to Rotary, The added exposure these plates give Rotary, will allow our communities to see where and how Rotary is helping our communities. This exposure will help us introduce Rotary to more people and thereby will help us bring in more new members. What's our goal this year? One new member every month? This RLP is THE TOOL to help us bring in new members. And, the dol-



lars received from our sales is returned to the CLUBS to do more community service.
